

Where to Get Your Vaccinations

Options for Bowling Green State University Employees

Have you been putting off getting your annual flu shot or other important immunizations because you haven't had time to see your doctor? Consider getting vaccinated the next time you visit your local drugstore or grocery.

Where Can I Get Vaccinated?

What Vaccines Are Available?

Ohio pharmacists can provide all vaccines recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) to:

- Individuals ages 13 and older, without a prescription
- Individuals ages 7 through 12, with a prescription
- They can also provide flu shots and FDA-authorized COVID-19 vaccines to anyone age 7 or older without a prescription

Most local pharmacies offer vaccines for human papillomavirus (HPV), influenza (flu), shingles (herpes zoster), pneumococcal disease (e.g., pneumonia, middle ear infection, sinus infection) and more.

New! Immunizations against RSV (respiratory syncytial virus) are now available for adults ages 60 and older and small children. Ask your local pharmacy if they carry the RSV vaccine or visit your primary care provider (PCP). Please note that local pharmacists cannot administer the RSV vaccine for children.

A Few Helpful Tips

- Call your local pharmacy before you visit to make sure they have the vaccines you need. While most pharmacies will have flu and pneumonia vaccines in stock, other vaccines such as the updated COVID-19 vaccine, may need to be ordered. Some vaccines may also require an appointment.
- Ask your pharmacy to submit your immunization claims under your medical benefits, not your prescription drug coverage.
